

There are two mechanical arenas in which I have been reluctant to enter -- automatic transmissions and overhead camshafts. I hope to never see the insides of the former, but since I have a 1969 Jaquar E-type and a 1987 Alfa Romeo Spider Veloce, both with DOHC (dual overhead camshaft) engines, I new that I eventually would need to address my demons head on. After 10 years of E-type ownership, the time had come for me to tackle the job of checking valve springs, replacing intake valve seals, and adjusting cam clearances. Besides, if my younger brother can tend to his 1970 E-type, then surely his wiser and more handsome older brother can, too!


2013 Membership Renewal Dues are Due

Overhead Camshafts (cont.)

Most automobile engines use valves to regulate the inflow of fuel and oxygen into a cylinder chamber, close off the chamber during compression and ignition so that expanding hot gases force a piston to rotate a crankshaft, and then allow for exhausting of the spent gases. These activities are carefully engineered to maximize efficiency and are mechanically controlled by a camshaft that uses egg shaped lobes to transmit "lift" to the valves for opening and closing as the camshaft rotates. It is important that the valves open, remain open, and close at the correct times during the combustion cycle.

(I say "most" because some engines use sliding sleeves, reeds, rotaries, etc. that perform the same control functions, but I don't have to worry about those in my Jag.)



The "lift" of the camshaft lobes can either be transmitted indirectly from deep inside the engine block using long pushrods with rockers and adjusters to act upon the valves. Or it can be transmitted by overhead cams pressing directly upon the valves with slightly greater efficiency and much greater complexity of parts with added timing chains and gears.





Overhead Camshafts (cont.)



The "problem" with overhead cam valve clearance adjustment is that the camshafts must be disconnected from the timing sprockets and chains (or belts) that keep everything properly synchronized. In many cars, this may not be an issue greater than an embarrassing lose of engine efficiency if not performed precisely. But some engines are designed with pistons reaching an apex so high in the combustion chamber that there will be contact with the valves if the camshafts are not exactly timed with the crankshaft. Thus, the designation of "interference" engine.






